MONEY MATTERS:

Money and race are two unspoken facets of American society, and we're trained from a young age not to talk about either of them. One piece of our work this summer is understanding *how* money creates barriers and what we can do to overcome these barriers.

The Sub/Urban Justice Internship Program charges no tuition or fees. Why? Because we want to make it as accessible as possible for every young person who applies. However, the program costs us about \$1,800 per participant to operate – for transportation, facilities rental, class supplies, staff salaries and more.
